Official information request regarding water leaks in the Wellington Region.

Thank you for your official information request dated Friday 30 June 2023. You requested the following information:

- What was the total number of known water leaks in the Wellington region covering the years 2018 to current date?
- What percentage of all known water leaks in the Wellington region occurred on the **public piping network** covering the years 2018 to current date?
- What percentage of all known water leaks in the Wellington region occurred on **residential properties** covering the years 2018 to current date?

We have considered your request in accordance with the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 and determined that we are able to grant your request in part.

The report is enclosed in our email to you. Pursuant to <u>Section 7(2)(a)</u> of the Act, some of the information has been withheld as it is personal about private individuals.

Question 1: What was the total number of known water leaks in the Wellington region covering the years 2018 - to current date?

Answer...

28, 852 reported leaks.

Question 2: What percentage of all known water leaks in the Wellington region occurred on the public piping network covering the years 2018 - to current date?

Answer...

93.87% on public piping network (non-private leaks).

Question 3: What percentage of all known water leaks in the Wellington region occurred on residential properties covering the years 2018 - to current date?

Answer...

6.13% on residential properties (private leaks).

-Disclaimer-

Data prior to the 2020/21 Financial Year (FY) is considered with low confidence.

There are two reasons for this:

- In 2018, there was a transition of service suppliers within our Customer Operations Group as we moved from an existing 10-year contract to a new Integrated Alliance. During this process, the transfer of data from the previous supplier to Wellington Water databases was not always complete, or in a format that could be easily integrated or accessed.
- 2) At the start of the new Alliance, a new front-end Asset Management and Maintenance system was planned for introduction. However, it took longer than expected, pushing the proposed start date from the 1st of July 2019 to the 1st of July 2020. As an interim measure, a system was implemented on short notice with the understanding that it would be temporary. Although it helped us at the time, it had limitations as it was not a fully-fledged asset collection and maintenance integrated system.

Note that the new system became fully functional from the 1^{st} of July 2020 and from the 2020/21 FY we can report with a high level of certainty.
