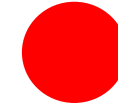
Supply and long-term drought resilience Nov 2022




Low risk of not being able to meet demand or needing water restrictions



Medium risk of not being able to meet demand or likely to need water restrictions



High risk of not being able to meet demand and high likelihood of severe restrictions

Supply risk	Comments	Risk level
Short term supply	Currently seeing all time high demand due to increased leaks on both private properties and the public network.	
Long term supply (drought resilience)	We are facing increasing likelihood of severe water restrictions this year e.g. Level 4 which would mean asking people to reduce indoor use.
