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Purpose

- 1. This memo reports completion of Asset Management Plans (AMPs) by Wellington Water and includes a copy of the South Wairarapa District Council (SWDC) Water Services Asset Management Plan (AMP) dated June 2025.
- 2. Wellington Water advises the AMPs will be published to its public website.

- 3. AMPs are the forward schedule on future work on assets that is risk prioritised, and cost estimated. AMPs were prepared by Wellington Water for the previous Long-Term Plan (LTP) 21 however, these were not formally endorsed by the then-Chief Executive (CE), nor updated following the completion of advice for LTP 24.
- 4. Wellington Water has subsequently updated the AMPs comprising seven documents which the CE has endorsed:
 - a) Quantity five individual metropolitan council AMPs reporting the state of each council's assets and their agreed investment plan for LTP24. The AMPs utilise the concise template provided by the Department of Internal Affairs which complements Water Service Delivery Plan (WSDP) work. Each AMP comprises approximately 30 pages and contains information that is generally in the public domain. The AMPs have a publication date of February 2025, which was when they were released to the WSDP Group (only) as an input to their work.
 - b) Quantity two regional water services AMPs for the Wellington metropolitan region, and the SWDC. These AMPs consolidate and distil a lot of knowledge from across the company and are intended primarily for internal audiences. The AMP for the Wellington metropolitan region comprises approximately 300 pages, and the AMP for SWDC comprises about 130 pages. Both AMPs contain information that is generally *not* in the public domain. The AMPs have a publication date of June 2025. The SWDC Water Services AMP is provided at the Attachment.

Next Steps – Publication

5. There is risk in making these documents public through the disclosure of information that is not yet directly in the public domain however Wellington Water is committed to being open and transparent with official information. Additionally, the quality of the AMPs is a concern, but this is indicative of Wellington Water's asset management maturity.
