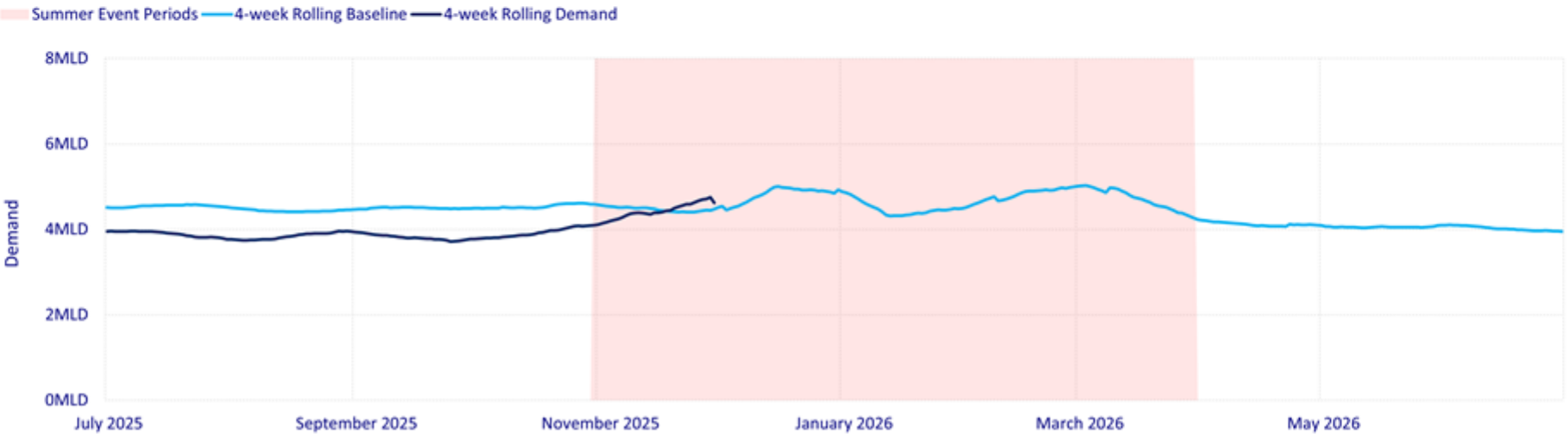


Water demand (MLD)

SWDC Water Demand Monitoring

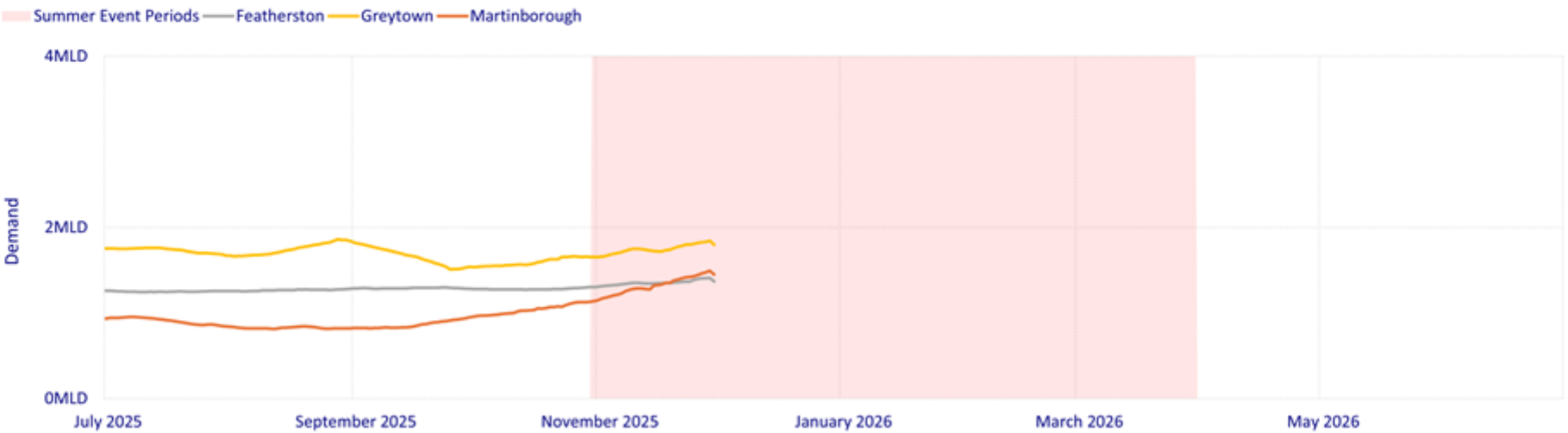
The graph below shows the demand in million litres per day (MLD) for SWDC. The red periods indicate times of heightened demand during summer events, which require careful management to prevent strain on water resources and ensure that there is adequate supply throughout the summer season.

SWDC Town Water Demand Monitoring

The graph below displays the demand in million litres per day (MLD) for each town in SWDC — Featherston, Greytown, and Martinborough. It tracks the daily water demand offering insight into how each town is progressing over time in terms of water usage. This helps to assess current demand levels and monitor trends across the region.
