I write regarding your official information request, transferred to us in part by Porirua City Council, on Monday 4 July 2022. You requested all correspondence between Greater Wellington Regional Council and Porirua City Council, and to and from Wellington Water that has been as a consequence of the Panel's Minute #4.

We have considered your request in accordance with the Local Government Official Information and Meetings act 1987 and determined that we are able to partially grant your request.

Please find attached in our email response your request all correspondence we hold on this matter.

Pursuant to <u>Section 7(2)(a)</u> of the Act, some of the information within the provided correspondence has been withheld as it contains personal information about private individuals. We have also withheld some of our draft working and internal communication on the basis that the end product will very soon be public (<u>Section 17(d)</u>)

As you may be aware, on 23 June 2022 the Panel (acting on behalf of GWRC as consent authority) hearing the consent application by PCC for a proposed upgrade to the WWTP for Porirua issued a minute requiring the applicant (PCC) to provide additional information. As a part of providing this information, the applicant (PCC) is required to get GWRC staff to certify the applicant's (PCC's) methodology.

I think it would be helpful for all parties if there was additional clarity around certain aspects of the Panel's requirements.

These are relatively minor and therefore are best addressed with direct correspondence with the relevant and respective staff at GWRC and PCC.

To this end can you please let me know which staff member in your respective organisation has responsibility for managing the RMA processes relating to this application, and their relevant contact details.

A prompt response would be appreciated. I look forward to that.

Kia ora

As context for your site visit, I've just been looking at the GWRC map viewer. If you turn on the Coastal Elevation layer, it shows that the wetland lies in the elevations between 100 and 200 cm above MHWS10. MHWS10 is defined on the website as "the mean high water spring tide exceeded 10 percent of the time. It is often used as a practical high tide level for infrastructure design works, and also for estimating extreme high (e.g. the 100-year Average Recurrence Interval) storm tides."

So, the number of times that seawater, and any contaminants from the discharge, would reach the wetland is presumably very limited, if it ever does. Do you have access to a salinity meter to see whether those pools in the **seawater** photos contain seawater or rain? From the aerial image in the GWRC map viewer I can't work out whether the pools photographed by are actually in the wetland area or further down the shore.


